1.	Minutes		
1.1.	The minutes of the last meeting were agreed.		
2.	Matters Arising		
2.1.	RD noted that Community Representative DMcG unfortunately has had to limit his commitment as Community Rep for personal reasons but will be staying on the Consultative Group. He also noted that this is a similar arrangement with LM. He suggested that a conversation may need to happen around this for the CLC.		

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2.2.	<p>There was a discussion around low attendance at CLC meetings with AD stating that there is no point in having the group if levels of attendance are so low. He added that he feels the group is not achieving anything. He noted that he will raise this issue at the GDA Board. RD noted that he agrees that the group needs a good representation in order to be successful but that he disagrees that the CLC isn't achieving anything. He made particular reference to movement on solutions to the traffic issues on GG Lower and the 'Student Integration Report' as being a direct result of concerns raised by the CLC. SF noted that the Bridewell Station considers the CLC a key part of garda/community relations with Grangegorman campus.</p> <p>It was agreed that a review of the CLC should be undertaken. RD agreed to circulate the Terms of Reference for the CLC to the group for review. He noted that he is open to suggestions from the group around ways to address these issues and to further represent the community. He also noted that the GDA is undergoing a Communications Review and that the review will also focus on this issue.</p>	RD	
2.3.	<p>BG noted that he feels that a Student Representative is very important to have on this group. RD informed the group that he had been in touch with DITSU before the student elections. He agreed to reengage with them now the elections are over.</p>	RD	
2.4.	<p>SF noted that under item 2.1 of the previous meeting minutes that the Sergeant met with the school and the Gardaí are trying to do this when they can.</p>		
3.	GAWG		
3.1.	<p>This group has not met since the last meeting.</p>		
4.	Community Matters		
4.1.	<p>SF informed the CLC that this year's Garda Community Sports Day will be taking place on the Grangegorman campus on 10th May. He noted that all the local school will be involved and that the Garda band may also be booked for the event.</p>		

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5.	Project Update		
5.1.	RD gave an update on all live projects on site. With regards to the Health projects on site he noted that the Residential Care Centre tender process for design is underway and that the handover of the Primary Care Centre to the HSE is imminent. He added that no official opening date has yet been set but that the facility is likely to open in the autumn.		
5.2.	It was noted that the construction of the Temporary Car Park at North Circular Road has commenced with Clonmel Enterprises as the contractor for the short contract. It was also noted that it will be run by a management company and that there would be a charge for users.		
5.3.	RD noted that there is no update on Student Accommodation Phase 1 as the GDA is awaiting Government approval to proceed with procurement.		
5.4.	RD informed the group that the Stage 2a design for the Academic Hub is about to start which when complete, will bring the design forward to planning phase. He noted that it could be Sept/Oct this year when this project could be submitted to Dublin City Council.		
5.5.	RD noted that unfortunately the grass pitches have to be closed due to major drainage issues. He added that Roadbridge is back on site working with pitches specialist to develop a solution and timeframe for works.		
5.6.	It was noted that there is no update on the PPPs.		
5.7.	LK gave a brief overview of the recent 1916: A Revolutionary Cabaret event in St Laurence's under Pathway 3: Cultural Mapping of the Grangegorman Public Art programme. RD noted that the public art programme is looking to hold a community day to showcase the projects/events under the programme to date.		

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6.	Any Other Business		
6.1.	AD queried if there has been any rise in anti-social behaviour around the campus lately in the evenings. He noted that he has noticed crowds of kids heading up to the area recently. RD noted that he hasn't had any reports about this but agreed to check with DIT Estates for feedback. SF noted that there have been sporadic calls to the Bridewell but nothing concentrated at the moment. He informed the group that there are now more local gardaí in the area and he has been around the area on the Garda bike more often.	RD	
6.2.	NiR noted that DCC have confirmed that they will be undertaking a traffic survey of the D7 Educate Together school area. He stated that this will be a preliminary survey which should kick-start a more comprehensive process shortly after.
