#### For information:

- 1. TU Dublin can confirm that we do not have any investments with exposure to Israeli companies.
- 2. The University has two Israeli companies on our list of suppliers, although there is no ongoing procurement with either.
- The University does not have any active bilateral partnerships with Israeli academic institutions or companies.
- 4. We are a partner on a Horizon Europe research project aimed at investigating the use of AI to predict patient outcomes in acute stroke which includes an Israeli hospital among its nine partners.
