Drawing Grangegorman Together

Some time ago, the Grangegorman Development Agency commissioned a series of really big drawings; we call them City Drawings. They were made by Jennifer and Jonathan of plattenbaustudio to capture a moment in time. The drawings include buildings which are built and others under construction, people, streets, walls, trees; all of the places in and around Grangegorman.

At Grangegorman we are revealing a piece of City for everyone to use; the City Drawings help us do that. We use them to test ideas for new places; by drawing them beside places that already exist, or places that are planned. This way we can all see how different ideas might work together.

We want you to sketch your thoughts on top of the City Drawing. We want you to travel through the City Drawing and make place, or place-make by drawing. It could be a building, or a landscape, an event; a memory, a dream, a play space, an unknown future; anything at all.

TILES

The City Drawing is huge, so we have split it into 8 smaller tiles. Each tile is A4 in size so you easily can download, print and draw over.

RULES

- 1. There is no such thing as a bad drawing, or idea.
- 2. Drawing is just like thinking with your hands.
- 3. Mistakes are the best, don't rub them out.
- 4. Please draw on the tiles only (we'll stick them all back together again)
- 5. Just start, anywhere.


