
- Schedules of Accommodation finalised after value engineering undertaken to re-align with project budget

LABOUR & LEARNING FORUM



Educational Planning Seminar – 23 April 2013

- Over 60 people from nearly 20 organisations attended.
- The Forum created the opportunity for organisations from the area to meet and discuss educational need in the area.
- Identified a number of educational challenges and opportunities for the North West Inner City.
- The adult education subgroup to review and plan their work for the coming year based on analysis from participants of the day.



CHILD POVERTY PROJECT



- Call for proposals from the Department of Children and Youth Affairs.
- The co-ordinator and the DIT worked with local organisations (at very short notice) to submit a project proposal for the area.
- First time such an approach was taken in the area.
- Regardless of the success of the project, the process has strengthened the partners' resolve to work collaboratively on educational projects within the NWIC.

Social and Economic Poverty Indicators



- The 2011 lone parenting ratio figures for the EAs in the Grangegorman area, are significantly higher than the national area. Arran Quay C had a lone parent ratio of 43.36% with Arran Quay D having a ratio of 50%, and Inns Quay C having 62.21%.
- There is a very significant non-Irish national population living in the GDA area. A number of the GDA EDs record levels above 40 per cent: Arran Quay A: 40.94 per cent; Arran Quay B: 46.20 per cent; Arran Quay C: 49.63 per cent; and Inns Quay B: 46.54 per cent.
- The unemployment situation in some of the EA's was considerably worse than the national situation. In 2011, Arran Quay D returned a rate of 38.73 per cent for males and 21.23 per cent for females in Cabra East C.
- A total of 26.43% of all people living in the GDA area had either no formal qualification, primary education or lower secondary level education.
